## An Original Charles Frace' painting of East Corinth donated to the Town!

A few weeks ago I received a call from a man named Tom Carrier of Minnesota. He bought this painting over 40 years ago in NYC at a small gift shop. It was painted by Charles Frace' who at that time was not famous. Over the next 50 years, Charles became America's number one Wild Life Artist.

Charles Frace' traveled through New England between 1955-62 with a Met photographer named Shelly Grossman and painted this sometime around then. This painting is a watercolor, but he stopped doing watercolors shortly after this and changed to oil painting for his wildlife paintings.

He was honored in 1992-93 with a one-man exhibit at the National Museum of Natural History of the Smithsonian Institution. His illustrations were in many publications; magazines, books, kids text books and even collectors plates

His paintings are amazing! Tom Carrier also sent a book on Charles Frace' to put here in the town hall for anyone that is interested in looking at it. You can also put Charles' name in the computer and come up with some web sites that show his work. It is impressive. He was called "The Master of Our Natural Domain."

Charles died in 2005 but his work lives on in his



paintings, like it will in the one here in the office.

This fall, inspired by the Vermont Humanities Council’s selections for **VT Reads 2016**, *The Endurance: Shackleton’s Legendary Antarctic Expedition* by Caroline Alexander and *Shipwreck at the Bottom of the World* by Jennifer Armstrong, Blake Memorial Library will explore the question, “What is the importance of adventure- large and small- in our lives?” Copies of both books are available at the library.
