Fall foliage season is a great time to visit Vermont State Park Day Use Areas, Vermont Historical Sites, and the Vermont History Center. **Free passes are still available at the library this fall!** We also offer passes to Shelburne Farms, VINS, the American Precision Museum, and Billings Farm and Museum—as well as a reduced rate pass to the ECHO Museum.

Thanks to a generous donation from the Montshire and Norumbega Trail Riders and the Corinth Fire Department, the library now has an automated external defibrillator (AED) available for community use. The AED is located in the library vestibule, next to the book drop, which is open 24 hours a day. For training resources, please see the library website.
